# Ordinary Time YEAR "C"

The term "Ordinary Time" may be misleading. In the context of the liturgical year the term "ordinary" does not mean "usual or average." Ordinary here means "not seasonal." Ordinary Time is that part of the Liturgical Year that lies outside the seasons of Lent-Easter and Advent-Christmas. During Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect but in all its aspects. The readings during the liturgies of Ordinary Time help to instruct us on how to live out our Christian faith in our daily lives.

We are all first and foremost members of the assembly who come to pray. It is our job as liturgical musicians to encourage and promote the sung prayer of the community. **It is never our job to "perform" or to "take the place of" the song of the whole community. It is not about OUR song or about what moves us as musicians... our job is to enable every person in the pew to find their voice. The music we sing must be the music of the whole assembly, and this music must serve the rites we celebrate!** The assembly gathers each weekend around the Altar (Eucharist), the Ambo (Word/Scripture), and the Priest (Presider). The assembly does not gather around the musicians. We must be transparent and humble in all that we do, so that people are more able to focus on the liturgy and prayer which we celebrate, and not on us, nor the music that is sung.

***The Church earnestly desires that all the faithful be led to that full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations called for by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people" is their right and duty by reason of their baptism.***

***IN THE REFORM AND PROMOTION OF THE LITURGY, THIS FULL AND ACTIVE PARTICIPATION BY ALL THE PEOPLE IS THE AIM TO BE CONSIDERED BEFORE ALL ELSE.***

**Cantor rehearsal will be once a month (typically the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Music Room). In addition to going over new music and all of the psalmody for the upcoming month, we will be talking about the role of cantor and how we can more effectively engage and encourage the song of our assembly. All cantors are expected to attend.**

The St. Francis de Sales Chorale is **OFF** for months of June, July, and August.

The Contemporary Choir will sing throughout the summer at 9:00 a.m. Mass, except for June 20 and August 15.

The Summer Pickup Choir will rehearse on Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m. in the Music Room and will sing at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. All parishioners and visitors are welcome to join us.

## **Ordinary Time & Summer Notes:**

*All time, all Seasons belong to HIM: Within and around these various cycles woven throughout our lives, Ordinary time stands over all of them, and in a sense can direct and guide them. Through the celebrations and observances of this season, the Church infuses all of it with the presence and action of Christ Jesus, always calling us to be disciples, always challenging us to keep Christ in the fore of our lives.*

*The rites and rituals with which we mark the passing of time do not ignore the other cycles that influence our lives. Rather, they enhance them and hone them, directing them towards Christ, whose ultimate return in glory orders all of it.*

- During Ordinary Time, the “Glory to God” is to be sung at every weekend liturgy. This is our song of praise and Glory to God. Let the people sing! Be sure to lead effectively and to **cue** the assembly **from the cantor stand** for each of the verses.
- The response to the General Intercessions will be spoken for all of Ordinary Time.

*While this period of Ordinary Time is a busy time for our parish, we must keep in mind that our mission as Liturgical Musicians is always first and foremost to **encourage and support the singing of the entire assembly.** We are here to help people pray through sung prayer. While we may offer a meditation after communion, or sing a prelude before mass begins,*

**OUR MAIN CONCERN SHOULD ALWAYS BE HELPING THOSE IN THE PEWS TO FIND THEIR VOICE, TO ENCOURAGE THEM, AND TO EMPOWER THEM TO LIFT THEIR VOICES TO GOD.**

*In a sense, we need to sacrifice our own desires for those of God and God’s people. Let the people sing!!*

Please note that when we gather for Sunday Eucharist, we are celebrating the Paschal Mystery of Christ. The celebration is already assigned readings, psalmody, and prayers by the Church. **Memorial Day** and **Independence Day** both have their own specific liturgies for those days respectively. **It is not the place of the Sunday Eucharist to substitute for those celebrations.**

## Notes & Information:

During the coming year, we will all be hearing much more about the translation of the new Roman Missal. This book is currently called the "Sacramentary" but will now reclaim the name "Roman Missal." This is the book that the priest uses during Mass which has all of the prayers which are prayed by the priest and the assembly. There will be changes to some of the texts that we pray as an assembly, including some of the things we sing. The final texts have been approved by the USCCB and were accepted and approved by the Holy See. We now await final editing and printing, and then implementation information from our bishops.

It is very important as we move forward and begin this journey, that every person who serves in any of the liturgical ministries understands that they are seen as a leader in our assembly. This is especially true of our musicians because we are visible during most of the Mass. I ask that all of you help our assembly by learning and owning these changes as we move forward. We need you to set a good example and help to lead our assembly through this transition. A few examples follow:

**Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.**

**Priest: The Lord be with you.**

**People: And with your spirit.**

**Priest: Lift up your hearts.**

**People: We lift them up to the Lord.**

**Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.**

**People: It is right and just.**

**Priest: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.**

**All: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.**

In addition to the changes in the Roman Missal, I would like to use this space in the schedule to give some information regarding our ministry as musicians and the directives that come directly from the GIRM (General Instruction of the Roman Missal).

## Entrance Antiphon/Introit:

47. After the people have gathered, the Entrance chant begins as the priest enters with the deacon and ministers. The purpose of this chant is to open the celebration, foster the unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical season or festivity, and accompany the procession of the priest and ministers. 48. In the dioceses of the United States of America there are four options for the Entrance Chant: (1) the antiphon from the Roman Missal or the Psalm from the Roman Gradual as set to music there or in another musical setting; (2) the seasonal antiphon and Psalm of the Simple Gradual; (3) a song from another collection of psalms and antiphons, approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop, including psalms arranged in responsorial or metrical forms; (4) a suitable liturgical song similarly approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop.

## Communion Antiphons:

86. While the priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion chant is begun. Its purpose is to express the communicants' union in spirit by means of the unity of their voices, to show joy of heart, and to highlight more clearly the "communitarian" nature of the procession to receive Communion. The singing is continued for as long as the Sacrament is being administered to the faithful. 87. In the dioceses of the United States of America there are four options for the Communion chant: (1) the antiphon from the Roman Missal or the Psalm from the Roman Gradual as set to music there or in another musical setting; (2) the seasonal antiphon and Psalm of the Simple Gradual; (3) a song from another collection of psalms and antiphons, approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop, including psalms arranged in responsorial or metrical forms; (4) a suitable liturgical song chosen in accordance with no. 86 above.
