Ordinary Time YEAR "C"

Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, this season is devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period is known as Ordinary Time. In these waning days of summer, as we approach autumn, we continue to hear Gospels focusing on the teachings of Jesus. They are leading up to those final weeks of the liturgical year in November, when we will hear about last things and judgment. We then, step out of the green, growing time of our life, into the deep purple stillness of Advent, when we contemplate the Christ who was, who is, and who, at the end of time, shall be.

At the risk of repeating myself once again, it is important to remember what our role is as Liturgical Musicians in this Catholic Parish. We are not here to entertain, to move, or to give warm fuzzies to those who gather. Our sole and primary task is to enable the assembly to participate in their parts of the Mass by giving support to them and enhancing the Rites that we come to celebrate. It is never about us as musicians, or about what moves us. If we are not enabling the assembly to be fully engaged in prayer, then we are simply not doing our job.

The assembly gathers each weekend around the Altar (Eucharist), the Ambo (Word/Scripture), and the Priest (Presider). The assembly does not gather around the musicians. We must be transparent and humble in all that we do, so that people are more able to focus on the liturgy and prayer which we celebrate, and not on us, or the music that is sung.

The Church earnestly desires that all the faithful be led to that full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations called for by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people" is their right and duty by reason of their baptism.

IN THE REFORM AND PROMOTION OF THE LITURGY, THIS FULL AND ACTIVE PARTICIPATION BY ALL THE PEOPLE IS THE AIM TO BE CONSIDERED BEFORE ALL ELSE.

Cantor rehearsal will be the 3rd Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. In addition to going over new music and all the psalmody for the upcoming month, we will be talking about the role of cantor and how we can be more effective as leaders of sung prayer. All cantors are expected to attend. Cantors that do not attend rehearsal will be expected to make-up that time with me before they will be allowed to serve as cantor/psalmist at Mass.

We must always be ready and willing to offer our best to God. God deserves nothing less. In order to truly lead, enable the assembly, and offer God our heartfelt praise, we must be prepared, rehearsed, and cognoscente of the texts and music that we proclaim.

Ordinary Time &

Fall Notes:

The rites and rituals with which we mark the passing of time do not ignore the other cycles that influence our lives. Rather, they enhance them and hone them, directing them towards Christ.

- During Ordinary Time, the “Glory to God” is to be sung at every weekend liturgy. Be sure to lead effectively and to **cue** the assembly **from the cantor stand** for each of the entrances.
- The response to the General Intercessions will be spoken.

“October is the month in which Mary Most Holy, Queen of the Holy Rosary, is venerated. Notes & Information:

During the coming year, we will all be hearing much more about the translation of the new Roman Missal. This is the book that the priest uses during Mass which has all of the prayers which are prayed by the priest and the assembly. There will be changes to some of the texts that we pray as an assembly, including some of the things we sing.

It is very important as we move forward and begin this journey, that every person who serves in any of the liturgical ministries understands that they are seen as a leader in our assembly. I ask that all of you help our assembly by learning and owning these changes as we move forward. We need you to set a good example and help to lead our assembly through this transition.

In addition to the changes in the Roman Missal, I would like to use this space in the schedule to give some information regarding our ministry as musicians and the directives that come directly from the GIRM (General Instruction of the Roman Missal).

The Importance of Singing:

39. The Christian faithful who gather together as one to await the Lord's coming are instructed by the Apostle Paul to sing together psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs (cf. Col 3:16). Singing is the sign of the heart's joy (cf. Acts 2:46). Thus Saint Augustine says rightly, "Singing is for one who loves." There is also the ancient proverb: "One who sings well prays twice."

40. Great importance should therefore be attached to the use of singing in the celebration of the Mass, with due consideration for the culture of the people and abilities of each liturgical assembly. Although it is not always necessary (e.g., in weekday Masses) to sing all the texts that are of themselves meant to be sung, every care should be taken that singing by the ministers and the people is not absent in celebrations that occur on Sundays and on holy days of obligation.

In the choosing of the parts actually to be sung, however, preference should be given to those that are of greater importance and especially to those to be sung by the priest or the deacon or the lector, with the people responding, or by the priest and people together.

41. All other things being equal, Gregorian chant holds pride of place because it is proper to the Roman Liturgy. Other types of sacred music, in particular polyphony, are in no way excluded, provided that they correspond to the spirit of the liturgical action and that they foster the participation of all the faithful.

Since faithful from different countries come together ever more frequently, it is fitting that they know how to sing together at least some parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin, especially the Creed and the Lord's Prayer, set to the simpler melodies.
